Year in Review

As Interim Executive Director, it is a great pleasure to share and celebrate PARA's growth and achievements contained in our year in review. PARA is proud to provide top quality parks, recreation, and cultural opportunities which in turn helps to strengthen and grow our community.

The year 2022 appreciated a robust return to golf, youth sports, aquatics, active adult programming, and memberships which demonstrates the high value residents place in our programs and services. Community support through sponsorships and donations toward three entirely new special events and programming makes a huge difference in the high level of amenities and opportunities we are able to provide. This level of com-



munity support demonstrates perceived value from our community and allows us to further support annual contributions from our governmental stakeholders. For more detailed information please see the receipts, statistics and additional financial information on Pages 10- 11 of this report.

One of the more significant issues this year was the retirement of Gary Minor who retired as the third of only three executive directors in PARA's 53-year history. His legacy includes PARA twice being recognized as Agency of the Year by the Alabama Recreation and Parks Association, tremendous growth in provision of top-quality programs and services, overseeing the opening of new parks, playgrounds, and new facilities to provide more opportunities for our community. He will be missed.

Highlights of the 2022 year included:

- The Inaugural Tuscaloosa Toyota Classic presented by PEPSI, the first professional golf tournament to come to our community and one of more than 20 EPSON Tour tournament venues across the nation was hosted at Ol' Colony Golf.
- The Inaugural Tuscaloosa Gauntlet, the first military-style obstacle course race was hosted at the Buddy Powell Pavilion and in conjunction with Alabama Marines Foundation.
- The Inaugural BOO! In the Park and Touch-A-Truck Halloween combo event was held in Sokol Park along with participation from five community agencies.
- Michael Cornwell was presented with 2022 ARPA Community Service Award for his trail building work and volunteerism.
- The PARA Foundation refurbished all plaques and lighting in Tuscaloosa Veterans Memorial Park.
- We received funding to replace the ballfield lights in Sokol Park South Sports Complex, after six seasons with no lighting.
- PARA was the host site for 22 tournaments and park events the majority of which were held in Bowers and Sokol Park Sports Complexes.
- Tuscaloosa United Soccer Club's Competitive teams dominated the Alabama Soccer Association's State Cup final four in Foley, bringing home state championships in five divisions and securing one state finalist title.
- A major refurbishment of the historic BAMA Theatre was completed and included custom designed carpet, handrails, and new seats.
- PARA presented the 46th Annual West Alabama Christmas Parade featuring Grand Marshals Lyda Black, Clell Hobson, Jr., Gary Minor, and Dr. Samory Pruitt.

The PARA Board of Directors is taking on the task of hiring new leadership for the future. In the meantime, we will honor the past, acknowledge the present, and remain dedicated to advancing parks, recreation, and cultural opportunities to enrich the quality of life in our community.

The PARA Foundation

The PARA Foundation is dedicated to raising funds to advance and strengthen quality in park and recreation within Tuscaloosa County Park & Recreation Authority properties. The PARA Foundation balance was \$1,242,623.86 as of Sept. 30, 2022.





In April of 2022 we celebrated the first birthday of Mason's Place All-Inclusive Playground, which was immediately one of PARA's most popular parks. A special check presentation from the Hank Poore Foundation and snow cones in the park helped celebrate this one-year anniversary. While we are still raising money to complete Phase Two of the project, we received a grant to purchase playground equipment at a 50 percent discount. We are proud to say that we have raised over \$2.5 million for this park, but we still have more to do.

The Tuscaloosa Junior Golf Academy raised over \$40,000 through *The Benefit* fundraiser to support young golfers to learn the game of golf, help youth to build character, and learn life skills.

The Tuscaloosa Associations of Realtors raised over \$22,000 through their 8th Annual *Bark in the Park* for the Will May Dog Park. These funds will be used for lighting and planting new grass for the dog park.

Ol' Colony Golf hosted the *Tuscaloosa Toyota Classic presented by PEPSI*, an official tournament of the 2022 EPSON Tour which is the official qualifier for the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA). The inaugural event was the first professional golf tournament to come to our community of West Alabama and one of more than 20 EPSON Tour tournament venues across the nation. There were over 225 volunteers from the Tuscaloosa community who came together to make this event a success.

All plaques and monument lighting were updated in the Tuscaloosa Veterans Memorial Park.

Ol' Colony Golf Complex



Ol' Colony continues to improve year after year and is one of the best public courses in the southeast. The Jerry Pate Design has gone through a few renovations and began the final phase of tree clearing and irrigation improvements to enhance the game experience.

The golf course covers 210 acres of beautiful terrain that surround two lakes and a creek that runs through the property, providing many challenges for the golfer. Five different tee complexes offer golfers of all skill levels many choices to enjoy while playing the gracious fairways and large green spaces.

Ol' Colony is home to the Tuscaloosa Junior Golf Academy, a program that reaches 17,000+ children annually. Our outreach program covers all 31 elementary schools, plus middle and high school golf programs. We reach these children through golf and instill life skills education in addition to teaching and coaching opportunities.

Ol' Colony Golf hosted the Inaugural Tuscaloosa Toyota Classic, an official qualifier for the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA) EPSON Tour. The inaugural event is the first professional golf tournament to come to our community of West Alabama and one of more than 20 EPSON Tour tournament venues across the nation in 2022. Tuscaloosa Tennis Center



The year 2022 was another terrific time for Tuscaloosa Tennis Center! Our member numbers have continued to increase, our patron list continued to grow, and our tournament registrations and programming/clinic numbers are at an all-time high. A new online court reservation software program called Court Reserve has significantly improved our member/patron experience and made internal operations more efficient.

In addition to open play, lessons, and clinics, we hosted tournaments for Universal Tennis, ITA/UTR, and Mississippi State University in Starkville, MS. These tournaments brought in top-level high school and collegiate players from several different states and colleges and represent excellent exposure for our local tennis community.

We hosted the Tuscaloosa Tennis Association, The RISE Center, and the University of Alabama Wheelchair Tennis Team for their fundraising tournaments. These tournaments raised \$69,000, all of which is being put back into our local tennis community. Furthermore, we hosted several USTA and community-based events such as USTA Mixed Doubles Championships, Alabama Senior Olympics, and more.

Arts Council of Tuscaloosa



The mission of The Arts Council is to promote and encourage the arts and humanities in Tuscaloosa County. The Council serves as the umbrella organization for 50 Member Organizations, offers educational programs, and manages both the historic Bama Theatre and Dinah Washington Cultural Arts Center. Member organizations are local nonprofit arts and cultural groups that contribute to the local community through their performances, events, and educational programming.

The Bama Theatre has been a Tuscaloosa feature since 1938 and continues to serve as a venue for film, music, theatre, visual art, and dance. In 2022, The Arts Council spearheaded a major renovation project in the Bama with the replacement of all seating and carpet, enhancing the vibrant design and details that make the venue a major landmark in Tuscaloosa. The Council recognizes volunteers, educators, and artists in the biennial Druid Arts Awards, and the Small Grants Program nurtures small and pilot arts activities.

The Spectra Partners in the Arts Guide, Poetry Out Loud, and Bama Fanfare educational programs serve over 40,000 children annually. The West Alabama Arts Education Collaborative is an initiative that seeks to increase access to arts education regionally through various strategies and activities, including: teaching artist training and recruitment, arts integration programs and training, partnerships with community arts organizations, and professional development in creative teaching strategies for classroom teachers. Additionally, in 2022-2023, the Arts Council took over the administration of the City of Northport's Rose Arts Education Initiative funding, which aims to provide high quality arts education programming in six Northport elementary schools.

Gallery exhibits sponsored by The Arts Council include the West Alabama Juried Show, and the Visual Art Achievement Awards. The Dinah Washington Cultural Arts Center, at 620 Greensboro Ave., includes a black box theatre, The Arts Council Gallery, The University of Alabama Gallery, the Grand Hall, professional catering kitchen, conference room, and office space. Events sponsored by The Council at the facility include multiple exhibits per year in the gallery, and collaborative events in the Grand Hall.




