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Rules for commercial burning:

- The burning must take place on the property on which the combustible fuel originates.
- The location of the burning must be at least 250 feet from the nearest occupied dwelling other than a dwelling located on the property on which the burning is conducted. It must also be 25 feet from any building and 50 feet from property lines and roadways.
- The burning must be controlled to avoid creating a traffic hazard on any public road, street, or highway because of the air contaminants emitted.
- Only vegetation and untreated wood may be burned. It is unauthorized to open burn heavy oils, asphalt products, plastics, vinyl materials, insulation, paper, cardboard, natural or synthetic rubber, salvage or scrap materials, chemicals, garbage, treated or painted wood, or any trash.
- Initial burning may be commenced only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. No combustible material is to be added to the fire between 3:00p.m. and 7:00 a.m. the following day.
- Burning shall be conducted only when there is good ventilation and when the prevailing wind direction is away from any built-up area in the vicinity.
- The fire shall be attended at all times until completely extinguished.
- Additional conditions can be mandated to cover specific open burning situations where additional controls or requirements are deemed necessary to minimize air pollution.
- Modifications of these regulations shall be at the discretion of the fire marshal.

Smoke Management plan can be as simple as using natural weather patterns to keep smoke from built up areas.
