Then & Now: Main Street (looking north), c. 1915



In the Calhoun County section of the Birmingham Age-Herald, a feature on Oxford was published in November 1915. It stated that "at least 90% of homes in the town are provided with electric lights and gas." The business community of the town also included a national bank, two hardware stores, one sales stable, six general shops, two blacksmith shops, one plumbing and electric shop, one laundry, one pottery, and brick kiln, one cotton mill, one wholesale grocery, two drug stores, two cotton firms one oil mill, one grist and feed mill, one fertilizer factory, one gin, one warehouse for cotton, one barber shop, one meat shop,

one railroad, and an excellent fire department.


