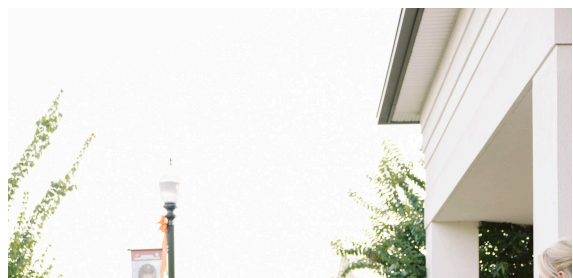




October Events Recap
