Regarding: Repeal of Adoption of Safer at Home Order and Reopen Tuscaloosa
Plan with Triggering Criteria
(CityLaw File No. A20-0592)

Authority:

By the authority vested in me by the applicable provisions of the laws of the State of Alabama, including but not limited to Ala. Code § 11-44B-7 (1975), pursuant to which the Mayor of the City as the Chief Executive Officer has the general supervision and control of all other officers and affairs of the City, and pursuant to the emergency powers vested in me as Mayor by Alabama State Law and the ordinances and resolutions of the City of Tuscaloosa, including without limitation Ala. Code § 11-45-1, Ala. Code § 31-9-10, and § 9-11 of the Code of Tuscaloosa, the Proclamation of Existence of a Local Disaster and Emergency issued on March 13, 2020, and the resolution of the Tuscaloosa City Council adopted on March 17, 2020, and as otherwise provided by law, I, Walter Maddox, as Mayor do hereby order and direct as follows:

Upon review of the ADPH Safer at Home Order amended May 8, 2020, and the fact that the COVID-19 trend lines for the City of Tuscaloosa do not differ from the state as a whole to justify a more restrictive approach than that taken by the State Health Officer. Therefore, Executive Order 2020-015 is hereby repealed. The City of Tuscaloosa will continue to staff incident command and will continue to monitor the local situation in consultation with local medical professionals. Should our local situation deteriorate, more restrictive measures may be adopted as necessary.

Implementation:

All Departments of the City and their respective employees to whom this Executive Order applies shall forthwith implement the same in accordance with its terms and requirements. Nothing contained in this Order shall relieve a person from any requirement to obtain a license or other authorization in compliance with applicable laws and regulations. This Order is not intended to conflict with, supersede or contradict any lawful ordinance or resolution duly enacted by the City Council. This Order does not create any right, benefit, or privilege, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by a party against the City, its departments, agencies, entities, officers, employees, or agents, or any other person.
