

... 📕 COVID-19 Patients Non ICU





Why a State of Emergency?


To be <u>proactive</u> in protecting the City's healthcare and economy over the next several weeks as 20,000 plus citizens begin arriving in Tuscaloosa






- 1. DCH Health System is experiencing higher number of inpatient COVID-19 patients
